

James J.F. Forest, Ph.D. is a Professor in the <u>School of Criminology</u> and <u>Justice Studies</u> at the University of Massachusetts Lowell. He is also a Visiting Professor at the <u>Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy</u>, Tufts University, and Editor-in-Chief of the peer-reviewed scholarly journal <u>Perspectives on Terrorism</u>. He has taught courses and seminars on terrorism, counterterrorism, and security studies for a broad range of civilian, law enforcement and military audiences for over two decades.

Dr. Forest has previously served as a Senior Fellow for the <u>U.S. Joint Special Operations University</u> (2010-2019) and as a faculty member of the United States Military Academy (2001-2010), six of those years as Director of Terrorism Studies (in the <u>Combating Terrorism Center at West Point</u>) and three years as Assistant Dean for Academic Assessment. Over the past 20 years he has given talks at the FBI Academy (Quantico), the National Defense Intelligence University, the Marshall Center (Germany), the NATO Center of Excellence on Counterterrorism (Turkey), the Asia Pacific Center for Strategic Studies, Joint Forces Staff College, The JFK School for Special Warfare (Ft. Bragg, NC) and several other military bases, National Defense University and dozens of colleges and universities. He has also consulted on counterterrorism strategies, research projects, and training initiatives, and has testified as a subject matter expert for terrorism-related court trials and for committee hearings of the U.S. Senate.
